### Cosmetology Performance Objective:

1. Acquire knowledge of laws and regulations of California's cosmetology establishment practices.
2. Acquire the knowledge of sanitation and sterilization as related to all phases of hair, skin, and nails.
3. Acquire knowledge of general theory relative to cosmetology including anatomy, physiology, chemistry and theory.
4. Acquire business management techniques common to cosmetology.

The curriculum for students enrolled in a cosmetologist course shall consist of sixteen hundred (1,600) clock hours of technical instruction and practical operations covering all practices constituting the art of cosmetology pursuant to Section 7316 of the Barbering and Cosmetology Act. Technical instruction means instruction given by demonstration, lecture, classroom participation, or examination. Practical operation shall mean actual performance by the student of a complete service on another person or mannequin. Such technical instruction and practical operations shall include:

<b>Health and Safety Considerations</b>  (Shall include the chemical composition and the purpose of cosmetic, nail, hair, and skin care preparations. Elementary chemical make-up, chemical skin peels and physical, and chemical changes of matter. Hazardous substances including training in chemicals and health in establishments, protection from hazardous chemicals and preventing chemical injuries, ergonomics, Theory of electricity in cosmetology, bacteriology, communicable diseases, HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis B and staph and Material Safety Data Sheets.)	<b>45</b>	
<b>Bacteriology, anatomy, physiology</b>  (Shall include Human Anatomy, Human Physiology)	<b>15</b>	
<b>Cosmetology Chemistry and Electricity</b>  (Shall include the nature of electrical current, Principles of		

operating electrical devices, and the various safety precautions used when operating electrical equipment.)	<b>25</b>	
<b>Disinfection and sanitation</b>  (Shall include procedures to protect the health and safety of the consumer as well as the technician. Proper disinfection procedures for equipment used in establishments. Disinfection should be emphasized throughout the entire training period and must be performed before use of all instruments and equipment.)	<b>20</b>	<b>120</b>
<b>Hair Cutting</b>  (Shall include the following techniques and procedures: Use of scissors, Razor (shaper), electrical clippers/trimmers and thinning (tapering) shears for wet and dry cutting	<b>20</b>	<b>80</b>
<b>Hair Styling</b>  (Shall include hair analysis, shampooing, finger waving, pin curling, and comb-out.)	<b>65</b>	<b>240</b>
<b>Permanent Waving</b>  (Shall include hair analysis, acid and alkaline permanent waving chemical straightening including the use of sodium hydroxide and other base solutions.)	<b>40</b>	<b>105</b>
<b>Hair coloring and Bleaching</b>  (Shall include the following techniques and procedures (also including, the use of semi-permanent, demi-permanent and temporary colors): Hair analysis, predisposition and strand tests, safety precautions, formula mixing, tinting, bleaching, high and low lights and the use of dye removers.	<b>60</b>	<b>50</b>
<b>Manual, electrical, and chemical Facials</b>  Manual facial include (Shall include cleansing, scientific manipulations, packs, and masks. Electrical facials the use of all electrical modalities, including dermal lights and electrical apparatus, for facials and skin care purposes; however, machines capable of producing and electrical current shall not be used to stimulate so as to contract, or for the purpose of contracting, the muscles of the body or face. Chemical Facials include chemical skin peels, packs, masks and scrubs. Training shall emphasize that only the non-living, uppermost layers of facial skin known as the epidermis may be removed, and only for the purpose of beautification. accordance with Section 992 regarding skin peeling.)		
<b>Eyebrow Beautification and make-up</b> (Shall include the following issues: Eyebrow Arching and Hair removal including the use of wax, tweezers, electric or manual, and depilatories for the removal of superfluous hair.) The subject of Make-up shall include skin analysis, complete and corrective make-up, and the application of false eyelashes.	<b>25</b>	<b>30</b>
<b>Manicuring and Pedicuring</b> (Shall include nail analysis and hand/foot and arm/ankle massage)	<b>10</b>	<b>25</b>
<b>Artificial Nails and wraps</b> (Shall include acrylic: liquid and powder brush-on, artificial nail tips, nail wraps and repairs)	<b>25</b>	<b>120 nails</b>
<b>Additional Training</b> (May include professional ethics, personal hygiene, good grooming, salesmanship, required keeping of student records, modeling, desk and reception, and care and styling of wigs, payroll deductions, how to seek and obtain employment, preparations of employment applications, and salon management.)		

The minimum combined total clock hours of 1600, including the technical instruction phases and opportunity for the student to act, necessary skills through practical applications developed under the supervision of the school's instructors.
